

Program Report: JENESYS2019 Inbound Program for ASEAN Youths (3rd Batch)

(Country: Cambodia, Theme: Sports (Canoe))

1. Overview of the Program


Sixteen representatives from Cambodia's junior national canoe team visited Japan for a period of eight nights and nine days from September 17 to September 25, 2019 as part of JENESYS 2019. After participating in canoe-related tours and lectures in Tokyo centered around the theme of sports (canoeing), the delegation visited Ishikawa Prefecture to participate in the 15th Japan Canoe Sprint Junior/Junior Youth Komatsu Tournament, joint practice with the Japan national team, and social gatherings to promote human interaction between Cambodia and Japan and also promote an understanding of Japan among the Cambodia delegates. We hope that this program further promotes the future development of sports in Cambodia and positive relationships between Japan and Cambodia.


